John Goehlich's love of art began when he was a youngster who attended classes at Chicago's Art Institute. Bard played an important part in the continuation of his art education. While at Bard, John studied with Louis Schanker and received a BA in art. After graduation, he worked for Doyle Dane Bernbach as an art director and had Volkswagon as one of his accounts. He also created interior renderings for L. Thayer and Co. In the late 1960s, John was dean of admissions for the School of Visual Arts in New York and designed children's books for Century Communications in San Francisco. From 1969 to 1997, John taught at the Illinois Institute of Art and also chaired the Communications Design department. He now lives in Rhode Island, where he paints and serves as a tour guide for the Newport Restoration Foundation. John is currently listed in *Who's Who in American Art.* One of John's paintings is included in an exhibition at the Newport Art Museum (through May 18, 2014), one of his interior paintings is included in an exhibition at the Redwood Library in Newport (until December 2014), and four of his figure drawings are displayed at the Colman Center of the Newport Art Museum (through May 10, 2014).
